1 x 15 minute qualifying session for LMP cars and 1 x 15 minute qualifying session for GT cars

An Official Test will be arranged at most, if not all, events, expected to be 1.5 hours duration.

Our fee for the 2018-19 Asian Le Mans Series is Euro 50,000 per driver per event.

Extra Costs

What is not included in the race fee:

• Engine and gearbox damage due to driver error (over-revs, ignoring alarms etc.)

• Insurance premium and excess – In the event of an accident the driver is responsible for the insurance excess payment. As a guide, subject to the drivers record, for the 2017-18 season the excess was Euro 40k with a premium of Euro 3,300 per driver per event.

• The driver is only responsible for damage caused when he is in control of the car, he is not responsible for damage costs caused by the other drivers sharing the car

• New Unofficial test tyres – some events may have paid practice on Thursday of race week.

• Drivers own flight, accommodation and transport costs. We can arrange accommodation and rental cars for you
